A few important things to note:

- 1. Of course, not every employer provides all of these as paid holidays, but the sentiment remains, just taking one or two days near a weekend gives you an automatic 3 to 4 day trip. That's plenty of time to explore a new place domestically, or a quick trip to the Caribbean for some relaxation.
- 2. Make sure that you aren't only taking Fridays off. It' a popular day for employees to take time off, so if you work in a team or department setting where multiple people cannot be gone at the same time, just be mindful that you're saving some Fridays for others.
- 3. By using time near holidays, you're saving your other days for the bigger trips like Spring break or longer summer trips.
- 4. Keep in mind that some of these days off will conflict with your children's school calendar, but we've never let school get in the way of travel, because travel is valuable learning! Also, most districts allow 10 absences per year. We usually push this to the max.
